THE LAW OF INHERITANCE.—The bill to amend the law of inheritance, as passed by the Council and to be discussed in the Assembly on the 5th proximo, contains the following provisions: Only children or lineal descendants of a deceased person shall be entitled to claim a legitimate portion. The rights of those claiming as heirs ab intestato remain intact. No heir shall in any case be entitled to claim or deduct the Falcidian and Trebellianic portions. The *Lex Hac Edictalis*, by which parents are entitled to claim the filial or child's portion, is abolished.

Natural-born subjects of the United Kingdom and their lineal descendants married or to be married in this Colony, without anti-nuptial contracts, may in conjunction with their wives, make their testamentary dispositions, precisely as if they were doing so under the laws and customs of England, and no legitimate or other portion shall be claimable by any person against or in defiance of such disposition.

THE WAY IN WHICH THE FARMER'S SHEEP GO
Amongst the numerous cases before the Magistrate on Thursday last, Oct. 18, was a preliminary examination in the case of a Kafir charged with stealing and killing 16 sheep and 4 bucks belonging to his master. It appears that the master had constantly missed one and two sheep from the flock of the prisoner, who had about 50 bucks of his own, and kept them in a separate herd. The master warned the herd that if these losses continued, he would either take him before the Magistrate or turn him away. The fellow was "huffed" at this, and pecked up his traps and marched off. Another herd on the farm having lost a kid, suspected the prisoner, and as soon as the fellow had gone he went into the kraal where he had kept his bucks, and examined the ground by pressing his knee into it. He soon discovered two holes carefully covered up, and calling his master, they found two more, each having the skin of a slaughtered sheep in it. The prisoner was at once pursued, apprehended and brought back; he was taken into the kraal, which the master had dug up in the prisoner's presence, when holes were found containing sixteen sheepskins and four buckskins, all of which the prisoner acknowledged having killed and thus concealed. While this case was going on, a letter was handed to the Clerk of the Peace from the fieldmaster of the Wisterberg, informing him that he had apprehended two Kafir herds, one having a Certificate of Citizenship, charged with stealing a hamel from Mr. Moseroff, sen., and on examining the ground near the prisoner's huts, another skin, and the wool of a third, were found concealed. Since the Circuit Judge sat here on the 7th September six sheep-stealers have been convicted by the Magistrate under the Act. No. 12, of 1860, and each sentenced to two years imprisonment and 25 lashes, and there are now ten more in gaol awaiting trial before the ensuing circuit. These criminals will have to be fed and cared for about four months longer, at a cost to the country of about £3 a month each; and if we go on the same ratio, there will be a nice batch by next circuit time. We have heard it suggested, and we approve of the suggestion that Magistrates should hold monthly court for the trial of all such cases. Let there be a jury composed of residents of the town, to assist him. No one will object to give one day, or half a day, of his time, once a month. The Magistrate should have power to inflict corporal punishment, either with, or without hard labour. The proceedings of course to be subject to revision by the Eastern Districts Court. This will clear our goals, and punishment would follow immediately upon the conviction of crime. We throw out the hint to frontier members of Parliament. There must also be a stringent Pass and Contract law for Kafirs residing within the colony, and every "native foreigner" residing beyond our borders, be he a Kafir or a "pet" Flingo, should be only allowed to enter the colony for the purpose of entering service—and not, as at present, to visit a relative "who is sick," or a wife "who has run away,"—or such pretexts for stealing—nor should any "native foreigner," on any pretext whatever, receive a pass to enter the colony, unless he can show satisfactory, that he has ample means of subsistence during his journey, his stay, and return.—*T. B. Advocate.*

PARLIAMENTARY PROCEEDINGS.
Legislative Council.

WEDNESDAY, Oct. 24.—In reply to the question of Mr. Goddinton, the Treasurer-General said that if the crowded state of the Alwal North gaol continued, it was likely the Government might arrange with the landlord for extended accommodation. On the motion of Dr. Abercrombie, it was agreed to refer the papers relative to the expenditure at Robben Island to a select committee. On the motion of Mr. Woolf, it was resolved to request the Governor to make provision for the addition of lunatic wards to the Graham's Town Public Hospital.

The debate on Mr. Cook's motion for the creation of quarterly sessions having been resumed, the motion was after some discussion adopted. The bill abolishing the High Commissioner's salary was considered in committee, reported without amendment, and ordered to be read a third time on Thursday. The motion of Mr. Wight, for a return of the number of civil sentences passed in the resident magistracies, Cape Town, the number of writs of civil imprisonment issued, and the amount of fees received by the messenger of the said court during the last 12 months, was agreed to.

THURSDAY, 25.—A petition was presented by M. Stein, from the Chamber of Commerce, in favor of the customs' tariff adopted by the chamber, and objecting to the proposed export tax. The bill for abolishing the High Commissioner's salary, was read a third time and passed. The motion of Mr. de Wet, for a return of the amount due by the government to the Guardian's Fund, was agreed to.

A message was received from the Governor, transmitting copy of the resolutions adopted by the Assembly with regard to the disposal of the convicts, and asking the concurrence of the Council therein. It was ordered that this message be taken into consideration on Friday. **FRIDAY, 26.**—Petitions were presented by Mr. Pote, from Mr. Colvidge, for a mission as a attorney of the Supreme Court, free of charge, by Mr. Goddinton, from 201 inhabitants of Uitenhage, on the subject of the annual subsidy for main roads, by Mr. Cawood, from 41 inhabitants of Bedford, and by Mr. Painter, from 89

inhabitants of Queenstown, respecting the law of master and servants &c. Leave was given to Mr. Pote to introduce a bill to amend the Insolvent law, which was read a first time. The motion for Mr. Vigne, for a return of wheat, flour, barley and oats imported and exported from 1st October, 1865, was agreed to. The message of the Governor respecting the disposal of the convicts, was referred to a select committee for report. The Beaufort Water bill, received from the Assembly, was read a first time.

House of Assembly.

WEDNESDAY, Oct. 24.—Petitions were presented by Mr. Wehmeyer, from 58 inhabitants of Albany against the voluntary principal; by Mr. Manuel, from 21 inhabitants of Simon's Town, against the cession of certain strip of land to the military authorities; by Mr. Murray, from the municipal commissioners of Tarkastad, for the establishment of a periodical court there. The debate on the second reading of the East London Harbour bill was adjourned till Monday. The Beaufort Municipal Loan Bill was considered in committee, reported without amendment and ordered to be read a third time on Thursday. After considerable discussion the House, in committee, adopted Mr. Daniel's motion to request the Governor to grant two pieces of land, the one 1269, the other 3000 morgen in extent, for the purpose of establishing a hospital at Queenstown. It was ordered that this resolution be considered by the House on Wednesday.

The Unauthorised Expenditure bill was read a second time and ordered to be committed on Monday. The Colonial Secretary moved the second reading of the Paper Currency bill. Mr. G. Wood was opposed to the bill in its present form. Mr. Mulder thought that it would interfere with the interest of the banks, and be of little benefit to either commerce or the government. Mr. Hell was not decided upon the matter. Capt. Van den Ven moved, that the bill be read a second time this day six months, but found no one to second his motion. Mr. Human had not yet read the bill, and hoped it would be withdrawn for a time. On the motion of Mr. Wood the debate was adjourned till Monday.

The Frontier Police Superannuation bill was read a second time and ordered to be considered on Monday. The Pounds bill and Inheritance bill were received by the Council and read a first time. The second reading of the last was fixed for the 5th Nov., the motion of Mr. de Korte to publish the bill for public information and put down the second reading for the 23rd Nov., having been negatived.

THURSDAY, 25.—Petitions were presented by Mr. Ayliff, from 62 inhabitants of Uitenhage, respecting the annual subsidy for the main road; by Mr. Solomon, from 89 laboring men in Cape Town, for employment or removal to some other country; by Mr. Ayliff, from 147 inhabitants of Uitenhage, against an export tax; by Mr. Solomon, from the Chamber of Commerce respecting the Customs tariff. The Beaufort Municipal Loan bill was read a third time and passed. On the motion of Mr. Rutherford, a resolution was adopted, expressing dissatisfaction with the return of crown lands furnished by Government and requesting the Governor, should the Surveyor-General's office be incapable to furnish an approximate return, to get it from the respective Civil Commissioners or Divisional Councils.

On the motion of Mr. Gain, the petition of the inhabitants of Cape Town, relative to the magistrate's court fees, was referred to a select committee, consisting of the mover and Messrs. Barry, Moleno, de Korte, Welsh, Solomon and Ziervogel. A message was received from the Governor, stating that he would be prepared to offer crown lands on lease from time to time. The irrigation bill was read a second time and ordered to be committed on Wednesday. The report of the select committee on the Main Roads Bill was considered in committee, reported, and ordered to be considered on Wednesday. The bill to repeal the Railway Acts of 1863 was considered in committee and progress reported.

Russia.—Moscow, Aug. 27. At a banquet given by the American embassy, Mr. Fox proposed the following toast:—"Each time when danger has threatened Russia, American sympathies have been with her. If American hearts were visible we should behold them as united to Russia as are here the Russian and American flags. May this bond be strengthened for ever by our blood." Advice from Tiflis state that the 40th infantry and 40th artillery brigades have left the Caucasus. Advice from St. Petersburg state that Prince Gortschakoff has just forwarded to President Johnson, in the name of the Emperor Alexander, a letter of thanks to the Congress for its vote of congratulation to the Czar on his escape from assassination. That communication will be sent by a diplomatic messenger to America, and be delivered solemnly by the Russian Minister at Washington. A medal to commemorate the occasion will be struck at the Mint of St. Petersburg, and will be presented to each member of the United States' Chambers; on one side will be engraved in Russian characters the reply of the Emperor Alexander to Mr. Fox, the American representative, and on the other the name of the member for whom it is destined.

Moscow, Aug. 30.—A deputation of Russian peasants have waited upon Mr. Fox, the American ambassador, to offer their congratulations in the name of the whole Russian peasantry. Mr. Fox then presented M. Gwosde, the spokesman of the deputation, with an American flag in remembrance of the occasion. In thanking Mr. Fox for this, Mr. Gwosde declared that, in case of necessity, all Russia would unfurl its banners by the side of those of the great American republic.
