TULBAGH DISTRICT COUNCIL, HELD 17TH JUNE.—Present, the chairman, A. Arnholz, W. Conradie, C. du Toit, S. du Toit, J. du Plessis, A. Faure, L. Rynoldse.

The minutes of last meeting were read. Before signing the same, Mr. Arnholz wished to know, whether the minutes should not be compared with the notes taken down by the Secretary at the last meeting...

The Chairman said, that it was only 14 days since the last meeting, and every one will remember what was done.

Mr. S. du Toit said, that he could not compare the one with the other, not understanding English, but he believed that what the Secretary had done in the minutes to be correct.

The minutes were then signed by all except Messrs. Arnholz, du Plessis and C. du Toit; but not compared, as the resolution agreed upon at the last meeting stated.

Mr. Arnholz said, before he could sign he must compare the record book with the notes, and after having done so, refused to sign and it wished to be noted: That he declined to do so for the reason that the minute book was not a true copy of the notes as taken down by the Secretary.

Mr. Reynolds said, if he had to pay he would not ask Mr. Arnholz for anything towards paying his share.

Mr. Arnholz asked whether the contract of G. Munnik was signed by himself and Suetjes. The Secretary replied in the negative.

The report of the commission appointed to examine the Books was then read.

Mr. Arnholz proposed, that, as it appears from the report, that the Secretary is an unfit person for that office, he be dismissed; upon which, the Secretary tendered his resignation.

Mr. Arnholz proposed, that the report of the commission be accepted, and that the commission be appointed also to receive the balance of cash, which ought to be in the hands of the Secretary that day...

Mr. C. du Toit said, that it would be better to call for tenders instead of applications; that he knew a person, whom, however, he would not name, who would do the work for £75 per annum...

It was proposed by Mr. Reynolds, seconded by Mr. Conradie, that the Council should grant to the old Secretary a gratuity of £30, who had resigned, because some of the members were not satisfied with the work...

Mr. Arnholz's proposal was carried, and nothing was allowed to the Secretary.

Resolved, that Mr. de Villiers must keep the toll until his lease expires.

The following accounts were passed—De Vaal, sundries, £ 32 15 6; J. H. Pienaar, road repair, 15 0 0; Wood for Bridge, 4 7 6; Stols road repair, 10 2 0; W. Theron, 11 17 6; Verster, 15 17 6; Munnick, 87 10 0; Gooßen, 124 0 0.

Mr. Theron demanded payment of £190 for gravelling road between Darling and Grey Bridge, as per contract.

Mr. Arnholz asked whether the contract was signed by all parties.

The Secretary said, that no one on the part of the Council had signed.

Mr. Arnholz then asked, who had pointed out the work to the contractor, which according to contract had to be done.

The contractor replied, Mr. Mohr, the late member for Breede River.

Mr. Arnholz wished to know, whether Mr. Mohr had any authority from the Council to point out the work; if not, Mr. Mohr was responsible.

Mr. Mohr might as well have told the contractor to gravel the whole line of road, which would have costed the Council thousands of pounds, and certainly the Council could not be liable.

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time of our earliest colonial possession, a distinction had been established by legal authority between two classes of colonists, and they were technically termed crown colonies and settlements.

Such colonies pursued their institutions for a time subject to the absolute power of the sovereign. As regarded the settled colonies the case was different. Their land had been taken possession of in the name of the Crown of England, and had been settled upon and occupied by British subjects.

On the subject of the Crown Colonies and Settlements in New South Wales, we have seen that the Crown Colonies were those which had been acquired by conquest or what was equivalent by cession.
