PARLIAMENTARY PROCEEDINGS. Legislative Council. TUESDAY, JULY 2.—A message was received from the Governor, transmitting the resolutions adopted by the Assembly respecting the withdrawal of the troops, and asking the Council to express its opinion thereon. Mr. Painter moved that an address be presented to the Governor, requesting his Excellency to resume the holding of Circuit Courts at Bedford, Fort Beaufort, and Alice, urging in support of his motion the inconvenience suffered by the farmers and the dissatisfaction existing amongst them. Mr. Steyn moved that all the places from which the circuit courts had been withdrawn should be included in the motion. After a lengthy debate the amendment was adopted.

THURSDAY, 4th.—With reference to the Governor's message, respecting the withdrawal of the troops, Mr. Goddout moved a series of resolutions, fully approving of those passed by the Assembly, and adding several additional reasons why this colony should be exempted from the payment of any contribution towards the maintenance of a military force in it. Council resolved to go into committee on these resolutions on Monday next. FRIDAY, 5th.—The principal business transacted to-day was the adoption of Mr. Goddout's motion to request the Governor to introduce a measure for the establishment of a Board of Health in Cape Town.

In reply to the question of Mr. Chase, relative to the issuing of freshhold titles to occupiers of land on Missionary Institutions, the Colonial Secretary said, that the matter was still under the consideration of the Government. The Council, by a majority of 8 against 5, refused to concur in the resolution respecting the opening of the Tradouw Pass, though it does not object to the employment of a portion of convict labour, and thus assisting the Divisional Council to undertake the work. Council adjourned till Monday.

House of Assembly. WEDNESDAY, JULY 3.—After disposing of some preliminary business, the House proceeded to consider the Criminal Law Amendment bill, as amended in committee, and after agreeing to some further amendments the bill was adopted and ordered to be read a third time on Wednesday next. Mr. Loxton having obtained leave to introduce a bill to amend the Cattle Disease law, which was read a first time and ordered to be read a second time on Wednesday next. The House went into committee on the Estimates, but immediately afterwards reported progress.

THURSDAY, 4th.—Petitions were presented by Mr. Haupt, from 64 inhabitants of Great Drakenstein, praying that the road through Frenchhoek and Drakenstein, from Draaiberg to Klappmuts Station, be proclaimed a main road; by Mr. Walter, from the Divisional Council of Caledon, against the petition from Breda-dorp, on the subject of its contribution for main road purposes. In reply to the question of Mr. Blake, the Colonial Secretary said, that by discontinuing the weekly posts to the fieldcornets, the annual saving would probably be about £1,500. On the motion of Mr. Welsh, the House resolved to confine its evening sittings to the consideration of the Estimates. The motion of Mr. Loxton, requiring that Executive Officers shall in future reply in writing to the questions put by members, was negatived. The House, in committee, resumed the consideration of the Estimates. The items under various heads were agreed to, whilst others were ordered to stand over. The only item reduced was the allowance to the Colonial Aide-camp, which was altered from £150 to £75. FRIDAY, 5.—A petition was presented by Mr. Proctor, from 44 inhabitants of Villi-radorp, for the construction of a main road between Draaiberg and Klappmuts Station. The whole of the sitting was directed to the consideration of the Native Passes and Contracts bill, which, after all, was not advanced a stage.
