**BOOKS RECEIVED.**

Numerous persons who pose as authorities upon the history of music are often surprised when faults are found in their facts and these would be experts could not do better than carefully study a new work published by Messrs. Methuen & Co. of London entitled "The Heart of Music." The author is Anna Alice Chapin who must be regarded as one of the most promising members of the rising generation of writers upon this particular subject. Though comparatively speaking a new entrant into the large field of authors, Miss Chapin shows that she is an expert in her research work for she has chosen a difficult task when she essays to give us the story of the violin, not only the history of its development from the crude ancient instrument to the wonderful violins of such great masters as Stadvarius and Amati but also the lives of great violinists. The author has accomplished her task in a no mean manner. Usually, books of this kind may be described as rather dry, being full of technical terms so much so, that even the most ardent devotee of music is driven to desperation by the boring manner in which the subject is dealt with. Such is not the case with "The Heart of Music" for, the writer deals with it in a most interesting and fascinating a manner. In fact, the whole book appeals from start to finish, no matter with whatever period of history is dealt with. Details are not lacking and, if some would think that the book is too short for so vast a subject; they cannot but admit that it is at least one of the most valuable contributions we have had for a long time past.
