An exhibition of daring trapeze work is given by Lohse and Sterling but one of their jokes would be best by its omission. Kelleway and Carne present some really fine feats of dancing, whilst Daisy Griff a newcomer to the programme, sings some appropriate songs in her quick changing act. Then Ivy and Dorice Lee prove as entertaining as ever and Sydney and Adelaide give a lively performance singing and dancing well. Last but not least A. C. Astor proves to be an unusually accomplished ventriloquist.

The New Bijou.

It is indeed difficult to find a picture to beat such a wonderful one as "The Four Horemens of the Apocalypse" but this has been done and on Monday next at the New Bijou Theatre, a picture which hits home more than the one which created such a sensation wherever it has been shown, will be presented.
