Capetown Notes.

(From Our Own Correspondent.)

The Capetown Jewish Relief Reconstruction and Orphan's Fund committee intend to inaugurate a special "Lightning Campaign," with a view to which a meeting has been called for Monday to take place in the Old Synagogue and an earnest request to attend has been addressed to all who have this cause at heart.

The Bnoth Zion Association holds its Annual Meeting to-day (Sunday) at the Zionist Hall. Mr. M. Alexander, M.L.A. and Mr. Rukik will be amongst the speakers.

The combined Zionist Organisations of Capetown are giving their annual Ball on Thursday 21st, for the purpose of raising money towards the Jewish National Fund. It promises to be a popular social event amongst Zionists and other members of the Jewish community.

There are no more indefatigable collectors amongst the Jewish people of this city than those of the various Zionist Societies. In addition to using to the full the many recognised ways and raising funds, they have lately taken to leaving little blue collecting boxes at private houses, and employing all the arts of persuasion on householders who do not show sufficient keenness in accepting the unsought gift of a potential debt.

Mr. Isaac Ochberg, the fame of whose exploits has re-echoed throughout the Jewish World has left Capetown to give a report of his Ukrainian mission to the Jewish Relief and Reconstruction Fund in Johannesburg and to arrange for co-operation between the S.A. Jewish Orphanage and its sister-institution at the Cape.

His many friends will welcome the announcement that Mr. Adolph Hallis, the South African pianist, is expected to arrive in Cape Town about the end of this month. Mr. Hallis' visit will only be a short one, as he has engagements to fulfil in London in the English autumn, but he intends to give at least one concert in the City Hall, of which particulars will be forthcoming later.

Little Miss Adelaide Newman, who left Capetown to study in London after showing great

promise as a pianist here, is meeting with much success though she is now only fourteen years of age. Last July she won the musical competition at the Aeolian Hall. She is now appearing as a soloist at the Colliseum in London.

The marriage between Miss Tilly Myers, of Cape Town, and Dr. J. B. Solomon, of Johannesburg, took place at the Great Synagogue, Gardens. The Rev. A. P. Bender officiated. Dr. J. B. Solomon is one of the first two to qualify in medicine in South Africa, having taken his final degree last year at the University of Cape Town. The bride and bridegroom are leaving this morning for Zeerust.

Arabs Promise Peace For Chief's Freedom.

A delegation of Arab sheiks from the vicinity of Jetach Tikvah has again petitioned Sir Herbert Samuel to release Abu Kish, an Arab Chieftan serving a 15-year sentence for leading the mob which sacked the Jewish colony in June, 1921. The Arabs assured the High Commissioner they were maintaining friendly relations with their Jewish neighbours and undertook to continue to live in peace with them.
