Capetown Notes.*(From Our Own Correspondent.)*

The Foundation Stone of the new Synagogue at George, Cape, was laid on Sunday by Mr. Alex. Comay. A most impressive and interesting ceremony was witnessed by a large assembly of Jews and non-Jews. Many of the prominent citizens of George and the neighbouring towns were present at the ceremony, amongst whom were His Lordship the Bishop of George, the Venerable Archdeacon Whaits and the Rev. Canon Price, of the English Church; Rev. M. de Villiers, of the Dutch Reformed Church, and Captain Wearne, of the Salvation Army.

The religious portion of the ceremony was conducted by the Rev. M. Woolfson, of Oudtshoorn, who gave a most interesting and instructive address. Mr. Mark Morris of Oudtshoorn, also addressed those present, and he was followed by Mr. Homa, Principal of the Hebrew School of Oudtshoorn. Mr. Homa in an exceedingly fluent address, traced the history of the Jewish nation and the erection of the first Synagogue in Palestine.

The Chairman, Mr. Alex. Comay, is the founder of the Hebrew Congregation of George, and is also the principal mover and worker among the Jewish community in that town, and it is due to his untiring energy that such rapid progress has been made in the erection of the Synagogue. A group of prize winners at the recent Eisteddfod festivals have combined and a successful and highly entertaining affair is promised. Among those who will take part in the programme are Miss Raie da Costa who will render piano solos and collaborate in a duet (The Kreutzer Sonata) with Mr. Geo. Among the pioneer settlers in Palestine are a large number of students, both men and women, who were originally students at Russian universities. They have now turned agriculturists, and while working hard during the day to develop the land, they devote the evening to study. The area in which they are at work is called "Tel Aviv" or Settlement of Springs—a name which sufficiently indicates the hope in their hearts both with regard to their work and the new era that has begun for their race. Their great need just now is for suitable books with which to carry on their studies, and it is to help to satisfy this need that their friends here are organising the recital.


