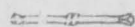

"Your Garden Flower," "The Song of the Willow Flowers," and "Longing." John Ireland has a new song published entitled "Santa Chiara" and Winifred Catford also has another composition entitled "Disenchantment." Other compositions to be found in this latest selection are two works for the organ by Alphonse Mailly, "Marche Solennelle" and "Pagues Fleuries," two selections for violin and piano by W. Griffith, "Grief" and "Mirth", and four easy compositions for the violoncello and piano by Ludwig Lebell.
