WITWATERSRAND HEBREW BENEVOLENT SOCIETY.

A Satisfactory Report.

The 33rd Annual Meeting of the members of this association will be held in the Hebrew High School on Sunday next for the purpose of receiving the Annual Report and Balance Sheet for the period July 1st, 1925, to 30th June, 1926, to elect Office-Bearers for the ensuing year and to transact General Business.

We have received a copy of the Annual Report and Statement of Accounts which provides interesting reading. During the past year 287 applications were received: 20 were refused, 267 were granted of which 3 loans are on hand to be paid out, amounting to £95; 12 Loans were cancelled (owing to applicants not having called) amounting to £350; 1 Loan was withdrawn amounting to £50; 251 Loans granted and paid out in accordance with the regulations, amounting to £8,051 10s. Of the Loans paid out, 216 were to married residents on the Witwatersrand, 25 to persons with families residing abroad, and 10 to single men. The respective amounts of the loans advanced were as follows:-4 at £75; 3 at £60; 1 at £59; 1 at £57 10s.; 14 at £50; 2 at £45; 57 at £40; 15 at £35; 67 at £30; 34 at £25; 40 at £20; 9 at £15; 4 at £10.

The average basis is £32 1s. 7d. compared with £31 13s. 5d. during the previous year. The advance shows an increase of £6 10s. compared with the previous year, and the repayment an increase of

£658 10s. 8d.

Comparing the figures of the past year with those of the preceding year it will be noticed that the financial position of the Society is somewhat improved, but in order that the members should not become too optimistic the Committee deem it their duty to point out that of the total assets of £12,395 17s. 3d. no less an amount than £10,672 11s. 4d. is cutstanding among our poor, where the sureties in many cases are perhaps not better off than the borrower.

The Report concludes with expressions of thanks to different donors, the Honorary Solicitors (Messrs Reeders & Rosettenstein) and other gentlemen.
