The Question of the Proposed Federation.

The movement which is taking place for the federation of the synagogues of the Witwatersrand and the bringing out of a Rav from Eastern Europe is occupying the attention of the committee and the proposal that the thirty shillings a year paid for membership should be increased to two guineas, the extra twelve shillings to be paid towards the cost of this new rabbi, occupied much attention. The subject has been discussed at length at every synagogue meeting recently but, despite that fact, it is not surprising that the "Chevra Kadisha" as the chief organisation representing Jewry in Johannesburg should bring it forward at their annual meeting. It is a serious subject and many different views are held upon it. Anyhow, as far as the Witwatersrand Jewish Helping Hand and Burial Society is concerned the members are to have an opportunity of discussing it at length at a special meeting which will probably be held on Sunday, October 3rd. Then it will be decided whether the membership shall be two guineas a year and more than twenty-five per cent. of the amount paid for charity shall be used for the purpose of bringing out an additional spiritual leader!
