



"TIP-TOES."

The much-heralded musical comedy "Tip-Toes" will open at the Opera House on Monday, and on that night, as on following nights, it is expected that the theatre will be filled to capacity. Bookings have been very heavy, and, in order to ensure a seat, one should get in early. One of the great attractions of the Gala Season, "Tip-Toes" has a strong cast of experienced London players, which includes Diana Maxwell, in the lead, Marjorie Fulton, Edgar Stanmore, Dan Booker, Leslie Hatton, J. H. Wakefield, Gaby Steedman, Bobbie Barker and Leon and Alys. The latter present a speciality dancing act, and those who have seen the show, remark upon their dainty turn. There is a well-dressed vivacious chorus which is an excellent background for the play of the leaders.

THE TIVOLI.

Du Calion's feats on the ladder require a steady head and during the process of balancing, he keeps the audience in a hilarious mood with his banter, and what appears to be nonsensical chatter. Fordham Brothers, newcomers to the bill, present a comedy acrobatic turn which is interspersed with enjoyable back-chat. Bert King, one time banjoist at the Waldorf Cafe, makes his debut on the music hall stage. Remaining over from last week are the irresistible Constance Evans and Monty Wolf, who made such a wonderful success last week. The Two Dewars are still delighting their audiences with their feats of strength and Zeta Mor in her character impersonation completes with One Sime Kid in a French comedy acrobatic play, a very fine all round bill.

THE ALHAMBRA.

While it is not altogether a war picture, "Havoc," coming to the Alhambra Theatre on Monday next, has to do with enough of the bitter world conflict to show how even such a catastrophe is not nearly so dangerous to human happiness as unscrupulous women. This sounds interesting and with such a theme as a basis Henry Wall, the playwright, undoubtedly has developed a most engrossing drama. It proved successful on the speaking stage, scoring hits in both London and New York. It is said to be even more compelling as a motion picture due to the wider latitude given for reproducing the vital war scenes.

"POP" CONCERT.

Saturday "Pop" concert at the City Hall will be a very attractive one. It is being given under the auspices of the Sixtieth Rifles, Toc H, and the B.E.S.L. Three hundred seats will be reserved for ex-service men, who will lead the community singing in war-time songs and melodies. In the second part of the programme a naval film will be shown by Kinemas, Ltd., for which Mr. W. J. Pickerill is arranging special music. The vocalist during the concert part of the programme will be Mr. Norman Lister. Preceding the film Mr. H. Batchelor Smith will sing "The Glory of the Sea," Sanderson.
