"THE WAY OF ALL FLESH."

On Thursday and Saturday (the theatre will be closed Good Friday) a great star will be seen in a sensational film, "The Altars of Desire," with Mae Murray playing a wonderful part. "CITY OF PLEASURE."

"The City of Pleasure," adapted from the story by Arnold Bennett, will be presented at the Astoria Kinema.

Briefly the story concerns Carpentaria, who planned and built "The City of Pleasure" with Ilam's money. Carpentaria was a musician, poet and idealist, and he intensely resented Ilam's affection for Juliette, his sister. A mysterious stranger enters their two lives and his first act is to threaten Ilam's

life in a captive balloon, which carries the young millionaire over this vast city built with his money. The stranger after a breathless escape from a scenic railway breaks into Ilam's apartment, and so terrorises his mother that she is stricken dumb and helpless. It would be unfair to detail further the vastly intriguing plot, but it is safe to say that patrons of the Astoria Kinema are due for a performance of a high class and most entertaining character.

"FEAR."

Henry Godfrey is so busy and important a lawyer that any serious result from his neglect of his adored wife and child simply does not occur to him. On this straightforward theme Hans Steinhoff has made "Fear" (starring Henry Edwards and Elga Brink), which is to be shown at the Astoria Kinema, the truth and sincerity of the portrayals constitute much of the film's charm, but it is to the director that the honours go. Each situation is handled with an intuition that is almost uncanny. There are no false notes, no strivings for mere effect at the cost of common-sense, no exaggerated histrionics and no sentimentality.

Elga Brink gives a sensitive portrayal as Elsa, and is extremely well supported by Henry Edwards as her husband. Gustav Frolich is an attractive artist, and Vivian Gibson Martin Manstad, Bruno Kastner and Igne Landgut appear in cleverly played minor roles.

Latest Musical Successes.
