



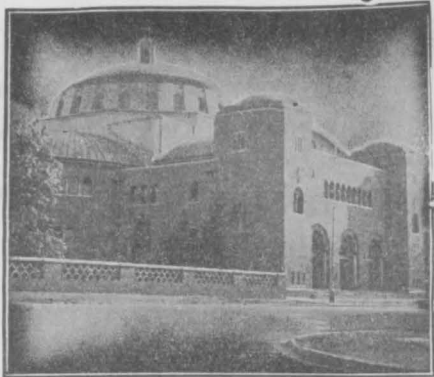

**JEWISH GIRLS' CLUB.**

At the Annual General Meeting of the Jewish Ladies' Communal League, which was held at the Jewish Guild on 20th June, when Lady Oppenheimer presided, the interesting announcement was made that Sir Ernest Oppenheimer, M.L.A., had donated a sum of £3,000 towards the purchase of a property which has been secured at the corner of Harrow Road and Hendon Street by the League, for the purpose of a Girls' Residential Club. It is confidently expected that the balance of £2,000 still required will soon be secured as a result of this magnanimous gift of Sir Ernest Oppenheimer's. The report of the League showed that they had spent a very profitable year, and the following were elected as office-bearers and committee:—

**JEWISH ORPHANAGE.**

The Annual General Meeting of the S.A. Jewish Orphanage was held on Wednesday last, 19th June, and a strong appeal was made, especially to the younger generation, to come forward and assist this deserving institution. Mr. W. Hillman, President, presided, and emphasised that as a result of the savings of seventy-eight orphans at present in employment, the sum of £1,600 had been invested in a Building Society, and expressed the hope that employers would find it possible to employ still more children. Mr. Bert Mendelsohn, Hon. Treasurer, in seconding the adoption of the annual reports, referred to the falling-off of donations and that very few of Johannesburg's Jewry were subscribers towards the institution, and deplored this fact. The interesting announcement was also made that an attempt would be made this year to provide the orphans with a holiday at the seaside, and in this connection an entertainment would be presented at the Jewish Guild on the evenings of Wednesday and Thursday, 26th and 27th June, under the capable direction of Miss Pearl Adler, when the entire performance would be carried out by the children of the Orphanage.
