### UNITED TALMUD TORAHS.

The United Talmud Torah Schools of Johannesburg now consist of nine schools, and where nearly 1,500 children are receiving Hebrew instruction. The revenue of the United Talmud Torah Schools is made up of subscriptions, fees and school fees, but as a considerable number of the children are being taught free, there has been incurred a monthly deficit of over £300. In order to meet this deficit the Council have inaugurated a campaign for securing new members, and also for obtaining increased subscriptions from many of its present members, and to date have succeeded in securing an amount of £633 6s., made up as follows:—

### BREVITIES.

### THE RADIUM FUND.

The Radium Fund now stands at £14,333 1s. 6d., and includes an amount of £21 which was received from the Golden Thistle Lodge, Transvaal, Scottish Constitution of Freemasonry.

Under the auspices of the Yiddish Literary Society, Mr. L. Feldman lectured at the Jewish Guild on Thursday last and selected for his subject "The Don Quixotism in Zionism."

A lecture was held under the auspices of the Johannesburg Zionist Association at the Zionist Hall, when Dr. W. Sachs lectured on the "Russian Colonisation Movement and the present Reuben Brainin Campaign in South Africa." We understand that considerable friction arose as a result of certain remarks of the lecturer, and the lecture was brought to a premature close by extinguishing the electric lights of the hall. It seems a great pity that Johannesburg Jewry should be forced into two sections through the present Reuben Brainin Vampaign, and certainly the promotion of lectures by well-known Zionist lecturers is not one way of pouring oil upon troubled waters.

On Wednesday last, 31st July, the Johannesburg Forum held their first meeting of their "Parliament," when a large audience listened to "Prime Minister" Mr. M. Rubenstein, outlining the general policy of his Government, whilst the first Bill submitted was one to Abolish the Jewry System. Mr. G. Colman is the leader of the Opposition and Mr. A. Pincus is Deputy Leader.
