

# Germiston Campaign Opens

## FINE RECEPTION TO DR. GOLDSTEIN

On his arrival at Germiston on April 3rd, Dr. Alexander Goldstein was received by Mrs. M. Margolius and Mrs. M. Guinsberg, at the residence of Mrs. Margolius, 34, Lambert Street, where a dinner in honour of the distinguished visitor was given. Dr. Alexander was accompanied by Dr. W. Sachs and Mr. D. Dr. Goldstein then followed with a most eloquent address. He spoke just over an hour, and the earnest of his expression and the very able manner in which he put the case of the Keren Hayesod touched the sympathy of all present. At the conclusion of his splendid address, which was enthusiastically applauded, he appealed to everyone for their support, and the response at the meeting resulted in £800 donations. A musical programme followed, which was sustained by Miss Louis Katz, Miss Osrin, Misses R. and M. Joffe.

Not only did they arrange the dinner, but they were indefatigable in spending a lot of time canvassing for donations, and to these two ladies are primarily responsible for the success achieved so far.
