## PORT ELIZABETH.

## THE ZIONIST INFORMATION BUREAU IN JERUSALEM.

Intending South African visitors to Palestine, not only Jewish, but also non-Jewish, should not fail to avail themselves of the services of the Zionist Information Bureau. This Bureau, situated in the very heart of Jerusalem, in the Clock Tower Building immediately facing the Post Office, should be the first point that every visitor should make for; because there he will obtain, free of charge and with every attention and courtesy, the fullest possible information and guidance as to his movements in Palestine. He will be assisted by an experienced staff in the drawing up of his itinerary, based upon the time at his disposal and his own particular interests. He will obtain all information about hotels, train, motor and other conveyance services, and all other particulars so necessary for the tourist to know. Not only will this free service greatly add to the comfort and enjoyment of his stay, but will in many ways enable him to effect substantial economies.

We constantly hear appreciation expressed of the services of the Bureau, and it is interesting to know that these services are made good use of by South African visitors. During the past two or three months alone some thirty to forty South African visitors received assistance from the Bureau, and the list of names includes a substantial proportion of non-Jews.

The S.A. Zionist Federation will gladly give intending visitors to Palestine the fullest further particulars about the Bureau, and will also be happy to supply copies of the "Guide to Jewish Palestine," an attractive booklet of neat size, containing a wealth of useful information (including a number of alternative itineraries) for the visitor and intending visitor to Erez Israel.

## JEWISH GUILD.

An intensely dramatic show will be presented at the Jewish Guild on Sunday, 12th October, at 8.15 p.m., which will be "The Thirteenth Chair," by Bayard Vellier. This well-known play should attract a large audience, particularly in view of the fact that it is being presented by some of the best amateur talent in Johannesburg.
