The same applies to the remittance of dues and contributions referred to above.

All affiliated bodies are asked to note that the above-mentioned date—December 31st—is final, and they are therefore most urgently requested to give their immediate attention to the above matters.

Attention to the same requests is upon those Zionist bodies which are not yet affiliated to the Federation, but which have intimated their intention of becoming affiliated in good time for the Conference. Many of these have not responded to special communications which have been addressed to them, and they are hereby notified that the same date, December 31st, which applies to bodies already affiliated, applies to them also, and they are therefore most urgently requested to carry out the necessary procedure with regard to affiliation, appointment of representatives, forwarding of resolutions, payment of dues and contributions, etc., without further delay.
