The claim that the Golden City is a centre for good music was well illustrated during last week-end. On Thurstrated during last week-end. On Thursday night, the Ketelby quartette gave a fine performance of Chamber music at the Carlton Hotel. On Monday evening the new Isador Epstein Trio was heard at the Grand National Hotel. On Tuesday evening there was a Jenny Sonnenberg concert arranged by the Johannesburg Musical Society and on the same night a Hislop concert was held at the City Hall.

The arrival in Johannesburg of Isador Epstein was claimed by lovers of good music as an event of importance. He came here with a reputation as a fine pedagogue from England, but his appearances as a performer have been all too rare. His appearance, therefore, at the head of a new trio established by himself was an event of musical import-

The new trio is composed of Mr. Epstein, as pianist; Mr. Otto Menge, as violinist and Mr. Hermann Becker, as 'cellist. The trio proved to be a delightful combination and presented classical and modern items with a rare delicacy and charm. Particularly graceful was the rendering of the Gretchaninoff composition. As a soloist, Mr. Epstein indicated the possession of remarkably fine technique. He has a fascinating style, joined with much beauty of expression. He is undoubtedly the most able interpertor of Beethoven in this country. Miss Hilda Harries was the vocalist of the evening and proved herself to be the possessor of a finely controlled lyric-soprano voice.
