Mr. Percy Cowen.

Completion of Twenty Years Work
as Secretary of the S.A. Jewish
Board of Deputies.

DURING this month, Mr. Percy Cowen, the well-known communal official, completes twenty years service as Secretary of the S.A. Jewish Board of Deputies. He was appointed to this post at the first meeting of the Council of the Board held in January, 1913. The South African Board was established in August, 1912, at a conference of South African Jewry held in Bloemfontein, at which the Council was elected, but no meeting was held till the following January.

The name of Percy Cowen is well-known throughout South Africa in view of the fact that correspondence from him is regularly reaching every corner of the land wherein Jews reside.

Besides his service with the Deputies, it will always be remembered that he was general secretary of the Jewish War Victims Fund in South Africa from its inception in February, 1915, to its close in 1927. During this period, a grave responsibility was placed upon Mr. Cowen, who had the enormous sum of £600,000 pass through his hands. This was the magnificent amount which South African Jews raised during twelve years on behalf of their stricken brethren in Eastern Europe.

Mr. Cowen has been secretary of the S.A. Jewish Orphanage since July, 1924. Since his arrival in this country in October, 1909, for the purpose of editing the S.A. *Jewish Chronicle* (which was at that time published in Johannesburg), Mr. Cowen has been intimately associated with every angle of Jewish activity on the Rand. He possesses an encyclopaedic knowledge of every aspect of Jewish life and development in South Africa. His loyalty to his duties are well-known and the conscientious manner in which he has carried out his onerous tasks, for a long period, has earned for him the esteem of all communal workers.
