It was she who had inculcated in their minds at an early age a love for Jewish nationalism and for Judaism. Chief Rabbi, Dr. J. L. Landau, said that the articles of Aunt Rachel must have made an indelible impression upon the young readers throughout the length and breadth of the country.

MR. I. H. HARRIS, who in the early days, was the Editor of the Zionist Record and was first associated with Aunt Rachel's contributions, said that he had reason to know that the children appreciated and loved her contributions. That indeed was her best reward.

Mr. J. Daleski, as chairman, associated the Editorial Board in a tribute to the work of Aunt Rachel.

Mr. David Dainow, Editor of the Zionist Record, eulogised the consistent manner in which Aunt Rachel had written her articles throughout so long a period. That in itself was a journalistic achievement of real note. He trusted that contributions from her pen would still appear from time to time in the pages of the journal.

MR. H. SCHAUDER'S UNDERTAKING

MR. H. SCHAUDER, M.A., who was recently awarded the H. B. Webb Research Scholarship of the University of South Africa, has left for overseas. The purpose of his journey is to carry out, under the terms of the Scholarship, research work on unemployment in Europe and America, with the ultimate object of applying to South African conditions the test of the experience of the older countries. older countries.

Mr. Schauder will spend some time in Britain, not only at a university centre, but in the industrial areas, obtaining first-hand information on the problem he is investigating. On the Continent he will work primarily in close association with the facilities of the International Labour Office at Geneva, supplementing such work with personal observation in the various countries, including, if possible, Soviet Russia. Thereafter he will proceed to the United States to study the problem in the country in which modern industrial methods have been introduced and utilised to a greater extent than in any other country.
