As a result of the dance, the Zionist Funds will benefit by a substantial sum.

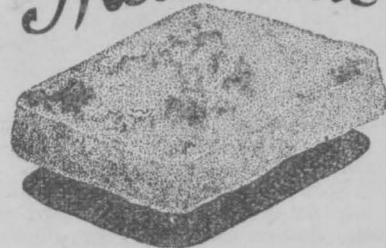
**MISS T. ALPER.**
