JACOBSON—ABRAHAMS.

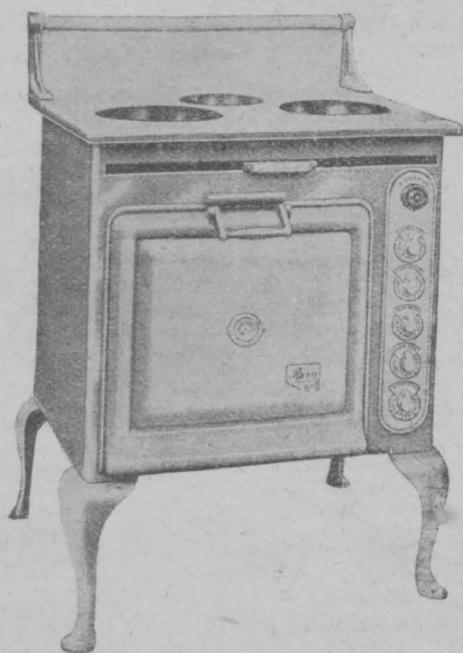
