

## From Town and Country

### Bloemfontein

On Sunday, the 28th ult., a large audience in the Communal Hall was addressed by the noted journalist, Mr. Jacob Landau, on the work of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency.

Mr. Landau dwelt on the precarious position of the Jew throughout the world, due to the rising tide of anti-Semitism, which was threatening to produce a condition akin to the Ghetto. He characterised the Jewish Telegraphic Agency as a very necessary instrument for the creation of an enlightened public opinion on the true facts of the Jewish question, and cited a number of instances to show its protective value to the Jewish people as a whole.

Mr. J. Philips, chairman of the Bloemfontein Hebrew Congregation, presided, and in his introductory remarks explained that Colonel Patterson, who was accompanying Mr. Landau on his tour, was unfortunately unable to be present.

Rabbi M. Romm, in a vote of thanks to Mr. Landau, said that anti-Semitism had its origin in the realisation by the world of its need for the Jew, who, because of his very contributions to civilisation, was hated and despised. The Jewish people ought to proclaim courageously to the world its right to equality of treatment.
