

Jewry in George

MANY INTERESTING FUNCTIONS.

The Jewish community of George has had a very busy existence during the last few weeks. This period of intensive activity commenced with the visit of Mr. A. M. Abrahams, President of the S.A. Zionist Federation, on behalf of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency. At a meeting held in the synagogue on the 11th ult., a creditable sum was subscribed towards the funds of the Agency, while on the following day Messrs. Abrahams and S. Miller interviewed a number of others, who readily subscribed.

The society paid a visit to Oudtshoorn on the 17th ult., to debate with the Oudtshoorn Jewish Guild on the motion "That Anti-Semitism will not Disappear with the Establishment of the Jewish State." George introduced the motion, the speakers being Messrs. D. Miller, S. Miller, and H. Comay, while Oudtshoorn was represented by Messrs. E. Rollnick, M. Goldberg, and B. Borkum. After a long discussion the debate was declared a draw by Mr. V. Aschman, the chairman.

On the 21st ult. the local community was visited by Mrs. R. Rabinowitz in the interests of the Polish Orphans' Campaign, and thanks mainly to the efforts of Mrs. M. Shlugman a splendid amount was contributed to the fund.

The monthly social evening was held on the 31st ult., and the whole community attended. Mrs. Y. Landsman, President of the Entertainment Committee, presided. Mr. M. Bendith opened the proceedings with a piano solo, and was well applauded. Mr. M. Berelowitz then gave an extremely interesting reading and was followed by Rev. C. Katz, who lectured to his audience on "The Hebrew Language." During his lecture the Reverend announced the formation of the Hebrew classes for adults. The next item was the resumé of events of Jewish interest for the previous two months by Mr. David Segal, whose interesting digest of news was well received. A few minutes of humour were provided by Mr. E. Toker, who treated his audience to a number of jokes and humorous tales. Mr. M. Bendith rendered a musical item.

After refreshments had been served, Mr. S. Miller, on behalf of the Zionist Society, extended a welcome to Mr. and Mrs. A. Comay on their return to George after a five months' absence overseas. Mr. and Mrs. Comay have always rendered yeoman services to the local Jewish community, and Mr. Comay, who is president of the Zionist Society, is also president of the Hebrew Congregation. Mr. and Mrs. Comay responded to the welcome in suitable vein.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING.

A GENERAL meeting of the Durban Zionist Association was held on Sunday, the 14th inst., at 8.15 p.m. at the Durban Jewish Club.

Mr. Kaplan, who was in the chair, deplored the lack of activity in the past two years, but stated that nevertheless £800 had been subscribed to the Baratz and Harzfeld drive, and £1,600 for the German Jewish Refugees' Fund, of which 75 per cent. went to Palestine and 25 per cent. to immediate relief. He further deplored the lack of cultural endeavour on their part.

Rabbi E. M. Levy, in moving the adoption of the report, also pleaded for a greater interest in Zionism and Judaism on the part of the community.

Several members, including Messrs. N. E. Abrahams, Melmed, M. Freed, J. Klatchko, B. Lurie and L. Rubin, also spoke in a similar vein, and put forward several useful suggestions.
