ERETZ ISRAEL

SCENES of great elation among the Bukharan Jewish community were witnessed recently, when 300 Bukharan Jews arrived in Eretz Israel. They were Bukharan refugees who for several years had been anxiously waiting in Afghanistan for an opportunity to immigrate to Eretz Israel.

At the beginning of this mouth there also arrived in Jerusalem twenty-two Jewish orphans from Yemen. This is the first organised group of Jewish children to arrive from Yemen and their coming was made possible by the assistance re-ceived from the Youth Aliyah De-partment of the Vaad Leumi and by the Hitachduth Hatemanim (Union of Yemenite Jews).

Miss Henrietta Szold, sponsor of the Youth Aliyah from Germany, had for some time interested herself in the lot of Jewish orphans in Yemen. After prolonged negotiations with the Government authorities she finally managed to obtain a special allotment of certificates for the transference of groups of such orphans to Eretz Israel.
