DEATH OF MR. SOLOMON HARRIS

An Ex-Mayor of Bloemfontein

THE death occurred on Monday of Mr. Solomon Harris, an ex-Mayor of Bloemfontein and a prominent personality in the civic life of the Free State capital.

The eldest son of a family of five, Mr. Harris was born in Dublin in 1880. He came to South Africa as a lad of 17 and, after a few years' apprenticeship in the drapery trade, founded with his brother the well-known firm of Messrs Harris Bros., in Bloemfontein.

During the 40 years that Mr. Harris lived in Bloemfontein he took a prominent part in many public activities. A man of vigorous initiative, he devoted himself to serving the common weal. He held the chairmanship of the National Hospital Board on several occasions, and also served as President of the Free State Municipal Association.

He is survived by two brothers and two sisters.

A "THINK OF OTHERS" FUND The Fine Work of Pupils of the Jewish Government School

HOW the pupils of the Jewish Government School in Johannesburg do what they can to assist a number of worthy institutions in the City, many of them non-Jewish, is told by the Principal, Mr. I. H. Harris, in a letter recently circulated among old pupils.

The students of the school have for a number of years maintained a "Think of Others" Fund whose proceeds are devoted to helping folk less fortunately situated. The students have willingly sacrificed many of their personal pleasures in order to organise small functions to add to the proceeds of this admirable fund. The fund has in the past made its contributions to such worthy causes as the Star Seaside Fund, The Hope Home, Children's Day, the Hospital, the B.E.S.L., the Athlone School for the Blind, the Deaf and Dumb School, and many Jewish institutions such as the Keren Hayesod, National Fund, Jewish Orphanage, etc.

In scholarship the School's reports testify to a standard among the highest, and as far as the influence for good of the school is concerned, one has but to point to the large number of ex-scholars who are usefully serving various communities in different parts of the world.

In the realm of sport, the School's reputation has been notable indeed. The Jewish Government School is one of the premier Rugby schools in Johannesburg, and its appearance in the annual cricket finals at the Wanderers has been almost an annual event.

The Headmaster's letter goes on to refer to the necessity of establishing a sound school fund for the purpose of developing the school's library, of purchasing and installing a radio, a film projector, and an epidiascope as well as other apparatus. The reason for the absence of such a fund is that the scholars have concentrated all their small contributions in swelling the "Think of Others" Fund. Mr. Harris asks old scholars of the Jewish Government School to help their Alma Mater in this respect, and there can be little doubt that those who owe their education to that institution and who to-day have happy memories of the fine training they received there, will not be backward in showing some small measure of their gratitude now.
