#### AT PARK STATION

STRANGE how a spectacle seen twice before still has the power to move the heart to warm feeling! I was one of the crowd of 300 people cramming the platform at Park Station to bid farewell to the band of South Africans, numbering close upon 100, who left the City on Wednesday evening and who will embark to-day on the "Duilio"—bound for a visit to Eretz Israel. People jostled and pushed excitedly. There was a din of voices commanding porters, anxious enquiries about baggage, last minute exhortations and Hebrew songs and greetings. Round ever window of the train was a ring of people, and from the windows the tourists looked with sparkling eyes, eyes filled with the joyful anticipation of seeing at last the achievements for which they had worked so hard and upon which so many hopes were centred.

There were veterans of South African Zionism, and there were younger recruits to the Movement. And as one looked, one realised that nothing could ever really daunt folk such as these. What matter though there are difficulties in our work in Palestine? A spirit such as these people possessed must, in the end, overcome all obstacles.

The Hebrew songs grew louder, last minute greetings more urgent . . . and then the cheers of the large crowd followed the train as it drew out of the station.

RABBI FREEDMAN ARRIVES
IN DURBAN

#### Induction Service Yesterday

RABBI A. H. FREEDMAN, the newly-elected Rabbi of Durban, arrived on Wednesday of last week from Ottawa, Canada, where he has held a similar position for four years. The Mayor of Durban, the clergy, members of the Council of the Durban United Hebrew Congregation and representatives of all Jewish institutions received him on board the "Duilio."

The Mayor, in welcoming Rabbi and Mrs. Freedman to Durban, expressed the hope that the new Rabbi would identify himself with the social activities of the city, as well as with the leadership of the Jewish community. Rabbi Freedman in his reply, spoke of the reputation that Durban enjoyed overseas, and assured the gathering that he would endeavour to foster a spirit of goodwill and co-operation throughout the community.

The induction ceremony took place yesterday, the 25th inst. at the synagogue, St. Andrew's Street. Rev. Dr. Shrock, of Johannesburg, assisted by Rev. N. Menachemson, of St. Andrew's Street Synagogue, and the Revs. H. Rubin and A. D. Kuperberg, of Park Street Synagogue, installed the new Rabbi. After the service a reception in honour of Rabbi Freedman took place at the Durban Jewish Club.


