She is the wife of the director of the New York Yiddish Theatre, Mr. Jacob Kalisch, and has performed in several plays written by him. Not long ago Molly Picon and her husband visited Palestine and she still retains vivid impressions of the high standard of

the theatre there. By arrangement with Bialik, who was still alive at the time, she gave performances of his work in Yiddish translation whilst in Tel-Aviv, Jerusalem and Ain Harod.
