## FINE CONCERT IN H.O.D. HALL

### Well-Attended Poale-Zion Function

THE spirit of Yiddish ruled at the H.O.D. Hall on Sunday evening last, the homely spirit of homely Yiddish, the intimate atmosphere of "mameloshen." The occasion was a grand concert organised by the United Zionist Socialist Party of Johannesburg. Despite rival attractions, the hall was packed to capacity.

Jewish artists whom the Johannesburg public know well, and whose fame does not belong to this city alone, featured on the programme: Cantor Berele Chagy, Madame Olga Ryss, Michael Doré, and Alter's Balalaika Orchestra, and a young actor who recently came from overseas, Mr. Faivel Ziegelbaum.

Alter's Balalaika Orchestra opened the proceedings with a fine rendering of Hatikvah and a number of delightful Russian selections, including "Souvenir Ukraine."

Mr. F. Ziegelbaum rendered a number of dramatic recitations, including a translation of Kipling's "Boots" and a swift sketch of Shakespeare's "Shylock." Mr. Ziegelbaum was at his best in the impressionistic items such as "Trains," and "The Iron Foundry," which seemed most suited to his dramatic style.

Madame Olga Ryss again showed herself the possessor of a fine voice in the appealing Jewish songs she sang and was heartily encored by the audience.

Michael Doré was heard in three violin solos, "Romanze Anduluze," "Elfentantz" and "Chanson Hindowe Rimsky," and proved himself to be a fine master of his instrument.

Cantor Berele Chagy rendered in superb style a number of lovely Yiddish folk songs. His beautiful voice and his sensitive interpretation made a deep appeal to the audience, who showed their appreciation of this great Chazan, the finest South Africa has to-day, in their prolonged applause. Alter's Balalaika Orchestra closed the programme with a performance of further Russian items.

Cantor Chagy, Madame Ryss, and Mr. Doré were ably accompanied at the piano by Mr. Hyman Sachs. Mr. Alexander Levin carried out the duties of Master of Ceremonies.

After the concert was over, a large gathering met at the home of Mr. and Mrs. J. Silverman at a happy informal reception to the artists, and particularly in honour of Cantor Chagy, who will shortly be going on a trip abroad. Mr. Ch. Saks, chairman of the United Zionist Socialist Party, in a brief speech, paid a tribute to Cantor Chagy.

## WITH THE S.A. CONTINGENT FOR THE CORONATION

AMONG the South Africans who have been selected to represent the S.A. Defence Force at the Coronation ceremony in London, is a young Jewish soldier, Staff-Sergeant I. H. Fisher of the 1st Hygiene Company of the S.A. Medical Corps.

Staff-Sergeant Fisher is a respected member of the Defence Force and has risen to his present position through the initiative and ability which has characterised all his activities. He left Capetown last week with the South African contingent on board the s.s. "Gloucester Castle." The contingent are due to return on the "Balmoral Castle" on the 14th May, but several members, of whom Staff Sergeant Fisher is one, have been permitted to extend their stay. Staff-Sergeant Fisher intends to take the opportunity to visit Lithuania, where a number of his relatives live. On his return to Britain, he will spend two or three days in Scotland at the invitation of the Gordon Highlanders who were here for the Empire Exhibition, and will then return to South Africa.

### Pretoria

The talented Jewish actor, Jacob Waislitz, will give a Yiddish recital at the Jewish Memorial Hall, Beatrix Street, Pretoria, on the evening of Wednesday, the 28th April. This fine actor, whose work in Johannesburg has earned the appreciation of the Yiddish community there, will perform items from Sholem Aleichem, Shakespeare, Peretz, Sholem Ash, Kipling and other notable authors.

## ANNUAL MEETING OF JOHANNESBURG WOMEN'S ZIONIST LEAGUE

THE 24th annual general meeting of the Johannesburg Women's Zionist League was held at the Ham Hotel, on the 23rd of March. Mrs. B. Reinhold presided over the representative gathering of members. Telegrams of good wishes were received from Dr. and Mrs. Shrook, and from the B'nai B'rith Capetown.

Mrs. Reinhold in her address commended the gathering amongst Dr. and Mrs. Landau were present. The chairlady extensively reviewed the work of the past year and drew attention to the increased revenue of the Keren Hayesod which had been obtained through the efforts of the League. There were now 1,060 members among the League compared with 800 during the last campaign. The chairlady paid tribute to Mrs. Reinhold who had so inspiringly led the women's campaign, and expressed her opinion that more women should come to this country to lighten and encourage the work of the women here. Mrs. Reinhold remarked on the increase in the sale of Sholem Aleichem and expressed the hope that the increase would become higher in the following year. The cultural programme had played an extremely big part in the activities of the League and the attitude was expressed to the Women's Zionist Council for the literature pamphlets which were issued from time to time. Their efforts on behalf of the Hebrew language were mentioned and the chairlady pointed out that every branch of the League had participated in this as well. She went on to review the numerous phases of activity which revealed that a great deal of concrete work had been achieved during the period under review.

Mrs. B. Patley was elected Life Vice-President. Mrs. Reinhold's name was inscribed in the Gold Book prior to her departure overseas.

The elections then took place and no new nominations to the Executive were made. Mrs. Reinhold was elected chairlady; Mrs. Patley, Mrs. S. Katzen were re-elected chairladies; Mrs. B. Segal, hon. treasurer and Mrs. A. P. Cohen, secretary. The committee is as follows: Mesdames Gluckman, Leftin, N. J. Gordon, Chagy, Marks, M. Udwin, R. Jacobson, Dawid Franks, Senior and Joffe.
