**PALESTINE TRADE SHOW
OPENED IN BUCHAREST**

Bucharest, March 26th.

AN exhibition of Palestinian trade products was opened to-day at the offices of the Jewish National Fund in Bucharest. The exhibition is one of the most successful yet organised in this country and many of Palestine's leading exporters, both agricultural and industrial, are participating. Excellent work for the success of the exhibition has been done by the President of the Roumanian branch of the Jewish National Fund, Dr. Samuel Singer.

In spite of the anti-Semitic feelings among certain sections in Roumania, trade relations between the countries are friendly. In view of the excellent outlets for Roumanian products in Palestine, the Roumanian Government has granted all facilities for the exhibition.

Taxes on all the products exhibited have been lifted by the Treasury, while the Ministry of Industry and Commerce has granted the necessary import permits.

At the opening the Roumanian Government was represented by Mr. Dannio Tecau, General Secretary of the Minis-

try of Industry and Commerce. Mr. Tecau declared that he was happy to strengthen the economic relations between Roumania and Palestine and his department was ready to do all in their power that these relations might develop.

Dr. Samuel Singer opened the exhibition saying that Jewish in Roumania were passing through a very difficult period but they still found the necessary energy to create economic relations that would lead to peace.

**10,000 DOLLARS DONATED
HEBREW UNIVERSITY**

New York, March 26th.

AT a banquet given in honor of Dr. Hugo Bergmann, Rector of the Hebrew University in Jerusalem, on Wednesday night, Mr. Roger Straus donated 10,000 dollars to the University.

Chancellor Chase, of the New York University, in addressing the banquet, referred to the Hebrew University as "a modern university in the best sense of the word." He added that the University "expresses the cultural aspirations of a forward-looking people."

**Birthday Programme of the
Contemporary Musical
Society**

A varied programme was presented on Friday last at the Roedean School by the South African Society of Contemporary Music at its first anniversary meeting.

The works chosen did not follow a definite period or style, as Mr. Lopez had managed to do in all the previous concerts, but were thrust upon the audience at random, Bach following the very modern Milhaud and Delius close upon the heels of Debussy.

The four piano items by Debussy, "Epigraphes Antiques" and "Boite a Joux," played by Mr. Lopez and Mr. Hyman Sachs, were the most delightful fare of the evening. Milhaud's Viola Concerto although aptly performed by Mr. Idelson, needs closer acquaintance before a full appreciation can be reached. Reger's Serenade for flute, violin and viola were competently handled by Miss Underwood, Miss Ann Sachs and Mr. Idelson.

Some of the brighter items on the programme were the songs of Delius to which Miss Stella Blakemore did full justice, and the interesting compositions for 'cello of Miss Helen Meugens who accompanied Miss Betty Pack.

**Blackshirt Candidate Joins
the United Party**

MR. JOHN SMIT, who was a Blackshirt candidate for Ermelo at the last Provincial elections and who has now joined the United Party, explained in a letter to "Die Vaderland" that although he belonged to the United Party, he is still a member of the National People's Movement. This organisation has an anti-Semitic platform and recently the Blackshirts merged with it.
