#### Cantor Berele Chagy

CANTOR BERELE CHAGY, Chief Cantor of the Beth Hamedrash Hagodel, left Johannesburg on Wednesday en route to America, where he will carry out an extensive concert tour.

Cantor Chagy ranks among the leading Chazonim in the world. He is probably the finest cantor ever to have made his home in South Africa. A man of wide musical learning, particularly in the field of Jewish folk music, and the possessor of a rich, golden toned tenor voice, he combines these qualities with deep artistic sensitivity, resulting in a rendering of the synagogal service at once masterly and profoundly beautiful. Chagy sings in the direct tradition of Israel. He does not borrow airs from grand opera or from German or other masters. For all his melodies he goes back to Hebrew music, to the century-old folk tunes of Israel and the traditional melodies shaped through and with the evolution of Chazonoth. From "Ma tovu" to "Oleinu," there is in his rendering of the liturgy all the pure mellowness and grandeur and pathos of suffering but eternal Israel.

Apart from the synagogal service, there is nothing Chagy loves more than a Yiddish folk song, in which field he has a deep and extensive knowledge. Recently he has written a book dealing with this subject, copies of which, I believe, will soon arrive in South Africa.

For all his renown, Cantor Chagy has remained a simple, sincere man. His is the gift of a warm heartedness and friendliness, a geniality and lack of artificiality not to be found in a lesser man.

Cantor Chagy will be away from this country about three to four months, after which he will again return to resume his duties at the Beth Hamedrash Hagodel.
