

WARSAW KEHILLAH **ELECTIONS**

Illuminating Statistics

LAST September there took place the elections to the Council of the Jewish Community (the Kehillah) of Warsaw, and a copy has reached us of the "Naie Volkszeitung" of September 10, 1936, setting forth the number of votes cast for each list sumbitted to the electorate, and the number of mandates assigned. Fortyfour lists were placed before the electors. Thirty-three of these obtained too few votes to entitle them to any mandates. The other 11 worked out as follows:

These figures show that even if we omit the very considerable number (nearly 8,000) of votes cast for the other 33 lists, the Revisionist Party obtained 821 votes as against 32,034 cast for the other ten lists detailed above, an utterly insignificant percentage. Furthermore, their total should be contrasted with those of the official Zionist parties. These figures of Jewish voting in the capital of Poland, with its immense Jewish population, are an eloquent commentary on the claim of the Revisionists to have hundreds of thousands of supporters in dreds of thousands of supporters in that country.
