MAURICE SAMUEL TO ADDRESS YOUTH MEETING

MR. MAURICE SAMUEL is to address a Mass Meeting of Youth at Johannesburg on Monday next, the 17th inst., on the subject, "The Structure of the Homeland." This special youth lecture will be held under the auspices of the Transvaal Zionist Youth Executive and will take place at the Coronation Hall, corner Claim and Plein Streets, commencing at 8.15 p.m. Dr. H. Bloomberg will be in the chair. A nominal charge of one shilling will be made for all members in order to cover the expenses. Seniors will be charged 2s.

Mr. Samuel will analyse the different groups and the various factors building up the new Palestine. He will deal with the countries of origin of such groups, their economic functions and their political views and ideals. The penetrating insight into the basis of modern Palestine will serve the purpose of giving local Youth a far better objective view of the modern complex Palestinian problem in all its different phases.

Sale of tickets is already underway, and a record crowd is anticipated. Tickets will also be available at the door.

Habonim Activities.

Transvaal Habonim is preparing for the sixth annual Chagigah which will take place during the week ending 22nd to the 24th May. Various competitions in the different branches of Habonim work are being organised in connection with the Chagigah which is being divided into two sections, cultural and sports. For the cultural competitions Shtilim, Bonim and Bonot are busy brushing up their knowledge of Jewish History.

Owing to the number of entries in each section it has been found essential to arrange preliminary competitions before the finals are held. Consequently, district Chagigot have been organised and the winning Geduot in each district will go forward to the finals of the competitions which will take place on Sunday, 23rd May.

The film of the fifth Habonim campaign has been seen by most Habonim centres in the country, and has created a fine impression. The success of the film—which presented a complete picture of every aspect of Habonim campaign—has now encouraged the S. Executive to embark upon a more ambitious enterprise, namely, the making of a film which will deal with Habonim throughout South Africa. This new film is intended to be a complete answer to the question "But what is it exactly that Habonim does?"
