
DUCATION DIRECTOR OF NITED HEBREW SCHOOLS

Revisionist Mis-Statements

Sir,—My attention has been drawn to a letter and an editorial note ap-pearing in a local Revisionist organ in connection with an informal meet ing which I attended at Krugresdorp on the 26th April. The impression is given that I made several mison the 26th April. The impression is given that I made several misstatements in that, although I made a statement to the contrary, there were in fact, no "negotiations" between the Executive of the S.A. Zionist Federation and the "New Zionist Organisation" delegation, and that I had incorrectly denied that the Federation had refused publication of the minutes of a conversation which took place on April 5 between the Federation's Executive and Mr. Jabotinsky.

I shall be obliged if you will pubthe following facts in this connection:

(1) The Executive of the S.A. Zionist Federation invited Mr. Jabotinsky to a meeting, with the object of bringing him back into the Zionist Organisation.

(2) Mr. Jabotinsky asked that the minutes of this meeting should not be released until they were agreed upon by him and by the Chairman of the Federation.

(3) When I was present at the meeting at Krugersdorp on Monday, April 26, the minutes had not been confirmed by Mr. Jabotinsky. Consequently any demand at that time for their publication was out of order.

(4) I mentioned the meeting beveen the Federation's Executive and (4) I mentioned the meeting between the Federation's Executive and Mr. Jabotinsky owing to deliberate mis-statements which were being circulated to the effect that the S.A. Zionist Federation were against peace with Mr. Jabotinsky and were doing nothing to secure such peace.


