Herman reviewed the activities of the "Organisation and Propaganda Department" and stressed the importance of an intensification of Zionist education of the Jewish masses, particularly at this critical juncture in Zionist history. Dealing with the development of the "Parties in Zionism," Mr. Herman pointed out that the Zionist Congress allowed for the expression of all shades of Zionist opinion and that all parties could further their programmes within the framework of the Organisation. The unity of the Organisation must be maintained.

Dr. Bloomberg at this stage initiated the discussion on "Partition"—the main burden of which was a complete condemnation of the proposals.

The proceedings were continually The proceedings were continually enlivened by clever cross-talk and interjections between the "Jewish State Party" led by Mr. H. M. Goldberg, the "Zionist Socialist Party," led by Mr. S. Hirschmann, and the "Mizrachi" representatives, whose main spokesman was Mr. J. Green. "General Zionists," however, under Mr. M. Levin, remained particularly calm and quiet.

The social arrangements were in the capable hands of the Benoni Zionist Youth Society, who organised a successful dance on the Saturday night, and a luncheon during Sunday. A pleasant little party was also given to the delegates by Miss Manachewitz on Sunday, evening on Sunday evening.
