RENEWAL OF LICENCES FOR THE YEAR 1932.

It is hereby notified for general information that renewals of all TRADING, PROFESSIONAL and OCCUPATIONAL LICENCES under Act No. 32 of 1925 (as amended), for the year 1932 are now due. Licences must be taken out on or before 31st January, 1932.

Licences under the COMPANIES ACT, No. 46 of 1926, for 1932, are now due and must be taken out on or before 30th January, 1932.

PENALTIES.

Any person who fails to take out a licence on or before the dates given above incurs a penalty calculated at the rates of 10 per cent. of the yearly licence duty for each month or part of a month during which default continues.
