Famous Director Dismissed Because Married Jewess.

Berlin.

The Nazi Minister of Education and Fine Arts in the State of Thuringia has dismissed Dr. Pretorius, the director of the famous State Opera in Weimer, where Wagner used to produce his operas, because he is married to a Jewess.

He has also dismissed the famous opera singer, Emil Fischer, because he is a Jew, and nine other Jewish singers employed in the Weimar Opera House.

Bialik Celebration Abandoned

Berlin.

A gathering arranged to celebrate the sixtieth birthday of Bialik, had to be abandoned at the last moment on the advice of the Police Presidium, who urged the organisers not to give the Hitlerist storm troopers any chance of stumbling on a Jewish meeting when returning triumphant from their victory torchlight procession.

Betrayed Hitler "On Instructions of World Jewry."

Berlin.

At the last conference of Nazi leaders held in Hitler's presence, Deputy Goebbels, the Berlin leader of the Hitlerists, said, according to a disclosure published by Otto Strasser (once a leading Hitlerist who is now a powerful opponent of the Nazi movement), that he had proved that Deputy Gregor Strasser (Otto Strasser's brother), who was President of the Nazi fraction in the Reichstag, and then left the Party, is of Jewish origin, and had betrayed Hitler on the instructions of world Jewry.

Anti-Semitic Doctors Rebuked.

Berlin.

Dr. Friedrich Brodnitz, son of Dr. Julius Brodnitz, the President of the Union of German Citizens of Jewish Faith, and himself the President of the Youth Organisation of the Central Union, brought a hornet's nest about his ears when he taunted the anti-Semitic doctors at the Conference of the Medical Association here with giving up their time to anti-Semitic agitation when they should be better employed in improving their medical knowledge.

The Nazi doctors howled with fury, and after an outburst of anti-Semitic invective forced the adjournment of the Conference, and went off singing the Nazi hymn.

Nazi Police to be Dismissed?

Vienna.

The Vienna Police President, Herr Brandl, has announced that police officers and men who belong to the Nazi movement will be dismissed, because no member of the police force can be allowed to belong to a party which approves acts of violence against certain citizens.

A mass meeting of Nazi police has been broken up, and the names of all participants taken.

At the same time, the Police President has replied to a complaint made by the Nazis that he is keeping Jews in the police force who are working against the interests of the Aryans. "There are no such things as Jewish police and Aryan police," the Police President declares. "Every member of the police force takes an oath to carry out his duties to the State irrespective of his beliefs," he says, "in order to ensure the maintenance of public order and the enforcement of the law."

Anti-Semitic Invasion of Bucharest.

Bucharest.

A huge procession of uniformed members of the anti-Semitic Iron Guard Organisation, wearing the swastika emblem on their fur hats, marched singing through the Jewish quarter of Bucharest on the occasion of the celebration of the unification of Greater Roumania. The police were out in force and prevented any anti-Jewish disorder.

About eight hundred Iron Guardists, headed by priests, afterwards attempted to erect a swastika over the grave of the unknown soldier, but they were prevented doing this by the police reinforced by military.

Fifteen Iron Guardists were wounded in the clashes with rifle-butts, and one priest and a large number of Iron Guardists were arrested.

Noble Jewish Family's Generosity.

Budapest.

The family of the Barons Hatvany, one of the few Jewish ennobled families in

Hungary that have remained Jews (the famous Jewish novelist and dramatist, Baron Ludwig Hatvany is a member of the family), has made a grant to the Budapest City Council for providing a hot mid-day meal to two thousand people in need every day for the next three months.

The family has in addition arranged to pay the rent for a hundred poor families for the next six months.

Anti-Semitic Publisher Imprisoned.

Salonica.

Vassil Missolonghitis, one of the publishers of the "Makedonika Nea," which has been publishing a series of anti-Semitic articles, has been sentenced to thirty days' imprisonment.

The proceedings against him were taken by the Public Prosecutor.

M. Louvaris and the Directors of the papers who were charged with him, have been acquitted. The court found that Missolonghitis was solely responsible for the articles.
