Jewish Deputies on German Situation.

QUESTION OF BOYCOTT DISCUSSED.

London, Tuesday.

The Jewish Board of Deputies at a meeting in London decided, by an overwhelming majority, not to proclaim an official boycott by British Jews of German goods and services.

Many Jews, however, are protesting against this decision, it is understood, and there are rumours of a forthcoming split.

Mr. Neville Laski, the President, admitted that General Smuts, Lord Cecil, Lord Reading and Sir H. Samuel had advised against the declaration of an official boycott.

"Grave Danger."

Mr. Laski himself made an impassioned plea not to press for a declaration on the ground of the grave danger which might result to Jews in Germany and the likelihood of serious reprisals.

The Board took the line that "the spontaneous desire for a boycott of German goods and services by Jews is a natural and inevitable outcome of the discrimination systematically practised against Jews in Germany."

The opposition leaders, however, refused to accept this declaration as being too nebulous.

The Board is still working for a united front in Jewry and is taking steps to call a conference in London in October of the

representatives of Jewish organisations to discuss the best methods of assisting the victims of German persecution.
