Charity Concert at Opera House.

The audience which attended the charity concert in aid of the Board of Guardians held in the Opera House last Sunday night may not have been as large as could have been desired, but it certainly wanted nothing in enthusiasm. As the artists came on to the stage they were received with loud applause and most of them were encored several times.

And indeed, the programme was an excellent one from beginning to end. It was varied and interesting and did great credit to the Hon. Organiser, Mr. Harry Weinreich.

The orchestra, under Mr. H. Michelson, gave some excellent numbers. Miss Reinet Wallis, a well-known singer in Cape Town, gave several very beautiful renderings; Mr. A. Robinson's tenor voice was heard to great advantage and was received appreciatively; Mr. Felix de Cola's rendering of several popular songs and his syncopation of well-known classical numbers were most entertaining and won rounds of applause. Other items given during the first half of the programme were a "Sunshine Ballet" by the pupils of the Kirsch School of Dancing, in which a large number of Miss Kirsch's pupils participated, and of which the effect of grace, colour and beauty was very delightful; conjuring tricks by Mr. Harry Nathan, who has become very well known to-day as a "magician" of no mean merit and who did wizardly things with handkerchiefs, flags and dice, leaving behind him when he walked off the stage a faint air of wonderment and surprise; and little Harry Stodel who sang both alone and with members of the Kirsch School of Dancing, and who was very charming and amusing.

The second half of the programme was taken up by the presentation of two scenes from the "Muizenberg Medley," recently produced at Muizenberg. This was a bright and cheerful review, and those who participated did so with great success. The principals who took part were Mr. Morry Lazerow, Miss Murielle Kadish, Miss Cecile Hurwitz, Mr. Herbert L. Stern, Mr. Lionel Berman and Miss Evelyn Jocum. Special mention must be made of Mr. Eddie Gawronsky, whose singing to his own accompaniment on the ukelele was very beautifully and sympathetically rendered. The music for the review was written by William Perl and arranged by Mr. Phineas Lewis.

CREATOR OF "POTASH AND PERLMUTTER."

New York.

Montagu Glass, the famous American playwright and creator of "Potash and Perlmutter," has died at the age of fifty-six.

Born in Manchester in 1877, he went to America when he was thirteen, and was educated at the College City of New York and New York University. His Potash and Perlmutter series, which was started in the form of short stories in 1910, include "Potash and Perlmutter," "Abe and Mawruss," "Potash and Perlmutter Settle Things," "Potash and Perlmutter in Society," "Business Before Pleasure," "His Honour Abe Potash" and "Partners Again."
