## Capetown Orchestra Activities.

To-morrow evening at the City Hall the Cape Town Orchestra will be conducted by Herr Lothar Kraus who has arranged a programme of Wagnerian music. The items include the Overtures "The Flying Dutchman," Prelude "Lohengrin," "Tannhauser," "Rienzi" and "Parsifal." Lilli Kraus, a celebrated contralto, who has appeared with great success at recent orchestral concerts will also appear at this concert when she will sing arias from "Samson and Delilah," "La Gioconda" and "Carmen." Altogether the programme will be an operatic one and should prove very interesting.

On Sunday evening in the City Hall, Violet Turnbull will make a welcome re-appearance. Miss Turnbull has a beautifully rich contralto voice which will be shown to advantage in the rendering of the aria "Lascia chio piango" (Handel). She will also give a first performance of a song composed by Mr. Pickerill entitled "An old Desire." A male voice quartet comprised of Messrs. Barr, Douglas, Shoult and Knight will also appear at this concert. Orchestral items will include the Overture "Leonore No. 3" (Beethoven), "The Welsh Rhapsody" (German) and the Overture "La Gazza Ladra" (Rossini).

On Thursday evening next their Excellencies the Governor-General and the Countess of Clarendon will attend the concert in the City Hall. By a special request of the Governor-General the "Peer Gynt" Suite (Ibsen) will be given, illustrated by the music of Grieg. The narrator will be Monica Dolphin who needs no introduction to the public, as it will no doubt be remembered the enormous successes achieved when she previously rendered the above work and also the story of "Pagliacci" in conjunction with the Orchestra. Solveig's song will be sung by Helen Deacon.

A performance of Mendelssohn's Violin Concerto will be given in response to numerous requests. The soloist on this occasion will be Mr. Alfred J. Gibbs, the able leader of the Orchestra.

The Overture "The Wasps" (Vaughan Williams) and the Scherzo "L'apprenti Sorcier" (Dukas) complete this programme.
