# Interdict Against Grey Shirt Leader.

#### YESTERDAY'S COURT PROCEEDINGS.

(By Telegraph).

Further to the interdict of von Moltke. leader of the Grey Shirts in the Eastern Province (reported in our issue last week) from printing and publishing certain documents alleged to have been stolen from the Western Road Synagogue, Port Elizabeth, an offer was made by von Moltke in the Grahamstown Court yesterday in his replying affidavit, to consent to the interdict standing as it is. Thereupon the plaintiff, Rev. Levy, obtained by consent the confirmation of the order of the Court. An action for defamation is to be commenced immediately.

In replying to the affidavit, Mr. Inch, another Eastern Province leader of the Grey Shirts, states that he entered the Western Road Synagogue on March 24th through a fanlight, and found the alleged documents.

Steps have been taken to have criminal proceedings instituted against all publishers of the alleged stolen documents.
