Racial Section at Berlin Exhibition.

Berlin.

A "German People and German Work" exhibition just opened, contains a special racial section in the Hall of Honour, the object of which is to demonstrate the undesirability of Jews. Photos show eminent former Jewish citizens whose faces have been crossed out with red lines. The explanation given is that they are un-German. Beneath these photos there are portraits of Nazi leaders who are stated to be of "true German blood."

£10,000 for German Refugees.

Jerusalem, Tuesday.

The Central Bank and co-operative institutions have decided to allot £10,000 for loans for German Jewish refugees for productive purposes, such as acquiring tools and buying stores. The loans will not exceed £100 in each case, and must be repaid in five years.
