Osman will sing a solo and the Municipal Choir will render the choruses. This concert will be the last Sunday concert prior to the Orchestra going on vacation.

n Thursday evening next, Miss Ivy Angove will make an appearance with the Cape Town Orchestra, when she will play the Glaxounov Violin Concerto with the Cape Town Orchestra. The Symphony will be Sibelius' No. 5.

On Saturday, June 23rd, the Webb-Lloyd Studio will present their annual display with the Orchestra. A beautiful ballet and divertissement is promised and it will be interesting to see how well South African dancers compare with the Russian Ballet dancers who have recently completed so successful a season at the pera House.
