Warsaw.

The Central Council of the Agudah Israel World Organisation has, at a secret session adopted a resolution sharply protesting against the restriction of Jewish immigration in Palestine. It has also decided to establish an Agudah Bank in Palestine. The campaign for the Agudah Keren Hayishub will be continued.

It has has been decided to establish an Agudah Palestine Executive on the lines of the Palestine Zionist Executive, to be headed by Dr. Isaac Breuer.

As was anticipated, the meeting has adopted a resolution against participation in the Jewish World Congress.
