Histadruth Ivrith.

A lecture was delivered by Dr. A. Birnbaum to the above organisation on Thursday evening last at the Zionist Hall. A representative gathering was present.

Dr. Birnbaum chose as his subject "Language," treating it on general scientific lines according to the theories of individualism and universalism. He personally favoured the theory of individualism. He traced the origin of all languages to the necessity of the individual for expressing himself. Speech was not created primarily in order to facilitate human inter-communication but mainly in order to express the individual's basic feelings. Thus it was the individual who created satire, dreams, prayers, mysticism and music. Dr. Birnbaum then went on to explain how these developed.

He concluded by saying that every language expressed to a certain extent the vibrations of the innermost chords of the human heart and soul. Language and thought were interlocked in such a way that it was not possible to separate them, and it was therefore the only medium which connected and united a people.
