



Malmesbury Zionist Society.

The monthly Zionist conversazione was held at the residence of Mr. and Mrs. Luntz last Tuesday evening. Mr. Luntz presided.

Rabbi I. M. Gervis, of Muizenberg, delivered an interesting and instructive address on "Zionism Past and Present." He dealt with the two main phases of Zionism as represented by Eastern and Western thought. The former was as represented by the ideas of Pinsker and Achad Ha'am, and the latter by that of Herzl, Nordau and Zangwill.

Pinsker's Zionism came from an inward urge as a result of two thousand years of tradition, culture, religion and Jewish history, while that of Herzl came from outward pressure caused by persecution, social ostracism and Hitlerism. The latter form of Zionism was not as sound as the former, as those who lost their social status in the lands where they resided, found their life to be one great void and emptiness, and they snatched at Zionism as their only hope to fill that emptiness. The lecturer dealt with the origin of the various parties in Zionism and said that to fill the emptiness, peace in the Zionist camp would be most welcome, but would not be lasting if compromise were arrived at by individuals who did not agree to shelve their personal differences.

Rev. Efron and Dr. Myers contributed to the discussion that followed the lecture.

Musical items were rendered by the Misses Ellen Misnum (piano solo), Esther Misnum (musical dialogue), Sadie Kahano-witz (recitation) and Mr. Joseph Meyers (violin solo).

Refreshments were served and the usual collection for the National Fund took place.

The Rev. Efron thanked Rabbi Gervis for his interesting lecture and Mr. Rechtman for having motored him out to Malmesbury. Mr. Beinart seconded by Dr. L. Goldman thanked the artists and the host and hostess.

A pleasant and instructive evening was concluded with the singing of the Hatikvah.
