Rev. Levy graduated at Jews' College, London University and Oxford, and was a member of the English Bar. He came to South Africa in 1924, and as spiritual head of the Durban Jewish Community has won golden opinions from every section of the community.

His departure will mean a definite loss to South African Jewry, and the Sydney Jewish community are to be congratulated on their choice of minister.
