The lecturer spoke also of Moses Maimonides (Rambam) whose 800th anniversary will be shortly celebrated all over the world.

Rabbi I. M. Gervis, in an inspiring address, referred to the omission of the Purim event by Gertz, and quoted a passage from Rambam based on a Talmudical saying that the Megilath Esther would never be removed from Jewish life. Eight hundred years of Jewish history has proved the truth of Rambam's conception of Jewish
