Zionist Socialist Party.

At the Open Forum on Tuesday night Adv. Maggie Oblowitz gave a lecture on "Women in the Zionist Labour Movement."

Mr. L. Matthews was in the chair.

Miss Kessler rendered a pianoforte solo and Miss Radowsky read the news service.

Miss Oblowitz said that the first women who had gone to settle in Palestine were determined to work on the land and underwent all kinds of hardships. It was, however, felt by the women who could not go to Palestine that they should contribute something real and constructive to the up-building of the country. Hence the organisation of the Wizo which to-day has about 70000 members. The policy of the Wizo was shaped by actual conditions in Palestine; a few years ago they had amalgamated with the Hitfadrut Nashim Zionioth and the Women Workers' Organisation. The chief function of the Women's Organisation lay in raising domestic work to a higher level, and trying to eradicate from the minds of both men and women the stigma of inferiority attached to all domestic labour. This was done by teaching domestic science and domestic economy in such a way as to place it on the same level as any other kind of work. It was important to imbue women with the feeling that their work was of definite value.

Wonderful work was done by the leaders of the Wizo, particularly by Ada Fishman, Rachel Katznelson and Golda Myerson, who had made a tremendous difference to the life of women in Palestine.

A discussion followed in which Mrs. Ch. Cohen and Messrs. Kagan, Abel, Telem, Laden and Achron participated.

Miss Oblowitz replied.

The Chairman proposed a vote of thanks to the lecturer for her interesting and informative address.
