Copenhagen.

The Jewish communities of Sweden have decided not to send any delegates to the forthcoming World Jewish Congress at Geneva. The Copenhagen Jewish community, on the other hand, intends to send an observer to the Congress.

KING CAROL HONOURS ROUMANIAN JEWS.

Bucharest.

King Carol honoured twenty-two Roumanian Jews with the Order of King Ferdinand, and five Jewish doctors with public health decorations for "exceptional patriotic merits."

The bestowal of these high orders for Jews came as a pleasant surprise to the Jewish population of Roumania in view of the fact that Jews are considered by the strong anti-Semitic circles as second class citizens.—J.T.A.

BELGIAN KING HONOURS ANTWERP JEW.

Brussels.

King Leopold II conferred the Knighthood of the Leopold Order on M. Salomon Frey on the occasion of his nomination as Honorary President of the Diamond Bourse.

M. Frey is one of the most prominent Jews of Antwerp, and he has been for many years President of the Bikur Cholim and Vice-President of the Jewish Hospital.—J.T.A.

Theodor Herzl's "Jewish State."—The Literature Department of the S.A. Zionist Federation has received an additional supply of the revised English translation of Theodor Herzl's "Jewish State." Every side of life in Germany to-day is examined, the material including the statements of eye-witnesses and the principal foreign correspondents, but being chiefly based on decrees and extracts from the official National Socialist Press. The Bishop of Durham furnishes a powerful foreword.

The large number of illustrations and also facsimile reproductions of Nazi placards and documents greatly add to the interest and value of the book. Price 6s.

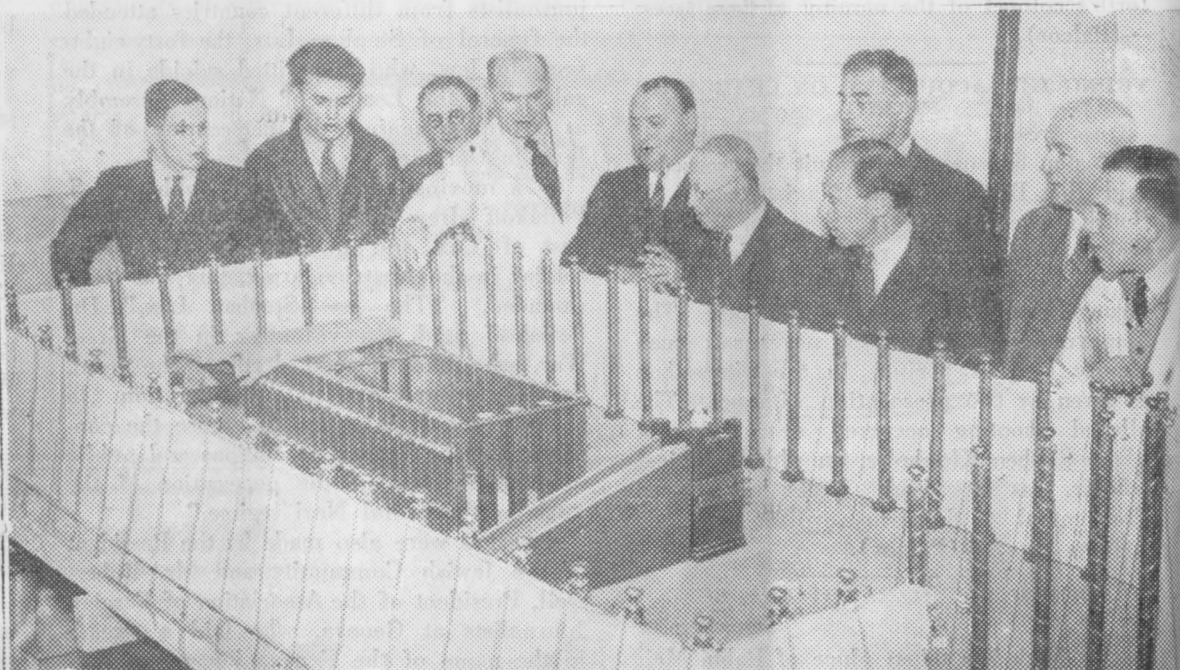
Palestine Temple Models for Empire Exhibition.

EXHIBITS INSPECTED BY PROFESSOR BRODETSKY.

An inspection of some of the exhibits to be housed in the Palestine Temple Pavilion at the Empire Exhibition was made by Prof. Brodetsky on Monday, 13th inst., at the invitation of the organisers, Mr. Z. Axelrod and Rev. B. Schechter.

The Palestine Temple Pavilion will provide one of the most fascinating displays at the Exhibition. The Pavilion will be on symbolic designs and within the various temple models will be set out with as close adherence as possible to natural surroundings.

In addition to the models there will be illuminated dioramas of Jerusalem showing the Holy City as it is to-day and some of its famous historical sites.
